## Biography/History

---

Jane D. Keeler received her training in nursing at the St. Luke's Hospital School of Nursing in New York City, Class of 1942. After World War II, she attended Columbia University's Teachers College where she received a Bachelor of Science (1949) and Master of Arts (1954) in Public Health Nursing.

After graduating from St. Luke's Hospital, Keeler served as Head Nurse in St. Luke's Hospital from 1942 to 1943. In 1943, she joined the United States Army Nurse Corps and worked on the west coast of the United States and in the Philippines. In 1945, she returned to St. Luke's Hospital to work for an additional two years as Head Nurse. From 1947 until 1958, Keeler worked for the Visiting Nurses Association of Brooklyn where she was a Supervisor and in 1956 became an Administrative Assistant. After working for the Visiting Nurse Association of Brooklyn, Keeler moved on to the National League of Nursing within its Department of Public Health Nursing. She stayed with the National League for Nursing for two years. In 1960, she became the Executive Director of the Visiting Nurse Association in New Haven, where she stayed until her retirement in 1982.

Keeler also served as a board member for many organizations. She served for, among others, the Hill Health Board, New Haven Connecticut (1968-1982); Hospice, Inc., New Haven, Connecticut (1972-1974); Connecticut League for Nursing (1961-1972) where she served as Treasurer from 1969 to 1972; and the National Task Force on Home Health (1981-1982). Keeler also served as an Associated Clinical Professor at the Yale University's School of Nursing and a lecturer in the Yale's School of Epidemiology and Public Health.

## Scope and Contents

---

This collection documents the evolution of Keeler's career in the nursing profession ranging from her training school days to the directorship of a well established visiting nurse association. The collection includes personal and biographical material, most notably a 1985 oral history interview (with transcripts) and speeches. Also included are various files reflecting her work with professional and educational organizations such as Association of Community Health Service Agencies, Council of Medical Social Services Board, Community Service Society of New York, Visiting Nurse Association of New Haven, National League for Nursing, Yale University.

## **SERIES 2. ORGANIZATIONS, 1935-1980.**

### **Scope and Contents note**

This series contains information on five organizations: The Board Members Organization (later know as the Association of Community Health Service Agencies) Council of Medical Social Services Boards, Community Service Society of New York, Visiting Nurses Association of New Haven, and the National League of Nurses. Information on the Association of Community Health Service Agencies includes background information and a run of its monthly publication *Pass it On*. The files of the Council of Medical Social Services Boards include speeches given by Mrs. C. E. A. Winslow, who was a long time board member of the Visiting Nurses Association of New Haven and president of the board from 1927-1937.

The bulk of this series reflects the Visiting Nurses Association of New Haven, the organization in which Ms. Keeler spent most of her professional career. Included are background files of the Visiting Nurses Association of New Haven, speeches given by former presidents and executive directors such as Elizabeth Fox who retired in 1949, reports, an anniversary bulletin, and a copy of the Visiting Nurses Association of New Haven's application to the National League for Nursing for accreditation. Files relating to the National League for Nursing include a speech by Martha Adams, and some reports and pamphlets.
